Hellenic Nursing and Rehabilitation Center Part of Your Neighborhood for 45 Years

he Hellenic is celebrating a 45-year history of excellence in the care, comfort and compassion of individuals needing skilled, restorative and long term care services. Founded by a group of Greek Orthodox women, they recognized the growing plight of elderly individuals left alone and unable to care for themselves within the community. These women formally organized a non-profit organization called the Hellenic Women's Benevolent Association (HWBA), marking the beginning of the Hellenic Nursing Home for the Aged.

Meet Trustee ARSINOI LAINIOTI

n June of 2018, Arsinoi Lainioti was voted in as a Hellenic Women's Benevolent Association trustee. Arsinoi brings a wealth of legal experience as she is a Greek-American-Brazilian attorney, who specializes in international estate planning, property transactions, inheritance and related tax matters. She has been a member of the Massachusetts Bar Association since 1991 and of the Athens, Greece Bar Association from 1997 to 2017.

Arsinoi practiced law in Athens, Greece for twenty years, founding and managing her own Greek firm, Law Offices of Arsinoi D. Lainioti, to serve the legal needs of persons and companies based outside of Greece, and those of expats living in Greece. While living in Athens, Arsinoi raised her two daughters and remained an active member of the expat community there until her return to the United States in 2017.

In 2017, Arsinoi founded her Massachusetts law firm, Lainiotis Law LLC, which serves the needs of the Greek-American community in Massachusetts. She specializes in estate, property and tax matters involving Massachusetts and Greece, with the assistance of her Greek-based colleagues and her oldest daughter who is a soon-to-be attorney in Athens, Greece.

Arsinoi received her Juris Doctorate Degree from the University of Minnesota Law School (cum laude) and her B.A. in Modern Languages from the University of Texas at Austin (summa cum laude). She is fluent in English, Greek, Portuguese and French.

The Hellenic Women's Association trustees welcome Arsinoi and look forward to working with her in the future.

n November 2018, the Hellenic Women's Benevolent Association (HWBA) held its annual Radiothon. The Radiothon has become a fall tradition and major fundraiser for The Hellenic.

With the support and generosity of donors over the years, HWBA has been able to fund projects which have made a significant impact on the environment and services offered at The Hellenic.

This year's Radiothon raised monies for the newly established Resident Arts & Technology Fund. Gifts to this fund were earmarked for art, entertainment and other creative programming for the enjoyment of residents and patients. The program aired on WNTN 1550 AM Radio on the Grecian Echoes Program with Host Ted Demetriades and the Greek Voice of America show with Host Peter Cakridas. All air-time was donated and the hosts' on-air solicitation of gifts on behalf of The Hellenic was invaluable. The combination of on-air gifts and mailed or online gifts totaled more than \$70,000.

At The Hellenic, we believe in the positive impact of entertainment, exercise, spiritual programming, and socialization as part of an active lifestyle for our residents and patients.

Today some of these activities include: weekly exercise groups; stimulation activities using word

games, cross word puzzles, trivia, crafts and reminiscing; monthly pet therapy and musical concerts. However, we continue to explore new programs which are the right fit for The Hellenic and with these available funds, efforts are underway to introduce new programs for our residents' enjoyment.

As a not-for-profit organization, The Hellenic is focused on the quality of care and services provided to residents and patients. While resources are re-invested into the community and used to increase quality staffing, improve facilities, enhance services and activities, our needs sometimes exceed these funds. Tomorrow Til Surface

LIONEL REINFORD

Described as a "well-known and highly respected educator, community activist, and artist", resident Lionel Reinford has lived a life as colorful as his paintings. Born in Honduras and educated at Harvard University, Lionel became an educator specializing in Spanish. He taught at the former B.F. Brown Arts Vision School, Fitchburg High School, and public schools in Worcester County. "I wanted to be the best educator there was," he said. Lionel also became involved with Leominster's Spanish American Center, a nonprofit that serves the local Latino and Hispanic communities, as its executive director.

In time, however, he found his love for painting. He discovered a signature style which drew inspiration from his observations of art history, folk art, and nature. He uses what has been described as "bright colors, sinuous lines, and clear crisp compositions." Lionel has described his painting technique as a "plain style," to "show the world as he would like

it to be." He has been painting this way for more than 40 years.

Lionel continues to paint today in his "studio" at The Hellenic. His first book, *Tomorrow I'll Surface* is available on Amazon and his second book, *Glory Days* is nearly complete.
